1. Protected Sites and Species

1.1 New Biogeographic Process Proposed for Natura 2000 Management

The European Commission is currently discussing a proposal with Member States to develop a new biogeographic regional process to enhance the management of Natura 2000 sites. The Commission previously coordinated biogeographic seminars for the designation of Natura 2000 sites, but the new process is different as, unlike site designation, site management is not legally binding. The Commission reports that this new biogeographic process should help to: set priority conservation objectives; identify and focus attention on the most pressing conservation and restoration needs for priority species and habitats; improve information exchange on work underway across the Member States; and implement a prioritised action framework involving Community co-financing. New biogeographical seminars are currently being proposed to build on the results obtained in the article 17 reports and are expected to be held every three years or so. This proposal was presented in the EU Nature Directors meeting and EC Nature and Biodiversity Coordination Group meeting in November, at which Eurosite is represented via the European Habitats Forum (EHF). Finland has already offered to host a pilot seminar for the Boreal region in the second half of 2011. The issue is expected to be discussed further at the next meeting of the EC's Expert Group on Management of Natura 2000 and EHF meetings, which are attended by Eurosite, so we will be able to provide further information as developments become known.

1.2 EU Guidance for Natura 2000 Management Issues

Wind Farms and Natura 2000

In October 2010, the European Commission published its guidance on wind farms and Natura 2000 sites. Whilst wind farms do not generally pose a major threat to wildlife, problems can arise if they are badly designed or sited. These new guidelines aim to minimise conflict between achieving the EU's aim to increase its energy from renewable sources, such as wind, whilst avoiding any negative impacts on Natura 2000 sites. It does not involve any change to EU legislation or policies but clarifies how existing laws should be applied. They highlight the importance of strategic planning, appropriate assessment and best practice. Future Guidance Documents

The European Commission intends to continue producing guidance documents to provide clarity on specific issues and aid the implementation of the Birds and Habitats Directives. The EC expect to begin consulting soon with stakeholders on the development of guidance for 'Aquaculture and Natura 2000'. Other topics for which guidance may be developed in the future include: fisheries impacts and related management measures; recreation and tourism; relationships between the Habitats Directive and Water Framework Directive and the Marine Strategy Framework Directive; and forestry. The EC is also considering making some updates and additions to the current Article 6 guidance document.

1.3 Consultations on Future EU Environment Financing

DG Environment is currently running two online consultations on the future of EU funding for the environment and input from as many stakeholders as possible is being strongly encouraged.

The first consultation concerns the future of LIFE+, which is only set to continue in its current form until 2013. Opinions are being sought concerning its objectives, priorities and modes of support, and the Commission will look at the results when formulating a new financial instrument. Eurosite has already submitted a response on behalf of the network, based on feedback received from members during a workshop in October: however, all members are also strongly encouraged to input to the consultation on this key funding mechanism for site managers. The consultation on the future of LIFE+ is open until 15th February and can be accessed via the following link: http://ec.europa.eu/environment/consultations/life.htm#_en.htm.

The second consultation concerns EU co-financing for Natura 2000, which will be used to inform a new EC Communication on Financing for Natura 2000 later in 2011. The consultation aims to assess whether the current levels of funding have been adequate to implement Natura 2000 effectively and how they could be enhanced in the future. 2. The Future of Biodiversity Post 2010

2.1 Closing the International Year of Biodiversity in Europe

The EU Belgian Presidency officially closed the International Year of Biodiversity in Europe by hosting a conference at the end of December on the theme of 'How to communicate the socio-economic value of biodiversity'.



The conference brought together stakeholders from the conservation community, as well as a number of representatives from businesses (e.g. extractive industries, tourism and retail sectors), who outlined their ideas as to how businesses can contribute to efforts to protect biodiversity. 2.2 The EU follows up the CBD Outcomes

The outcomes of the CBD COP10, especially the new strategic plan and the development of a strategy for resource mobilisation, were officially welcomed by the EU Environment Council in its meeting on 20th December. The Council also agreed to implement the new CBD strategy and targets within the EU, especially by mainstreaming the CBD commitments into other relevant policy areas such as agriculture and fisheries and by increasing resources (human, technical and financial) from all possible sources. The EU is expected to present a new EU Strategy for Biodiversity early in 2011, which will also incorporate the implementation of the EU's CBD commitments. 2.3 Launching 2011 as the International Year of Forests

The International Year of Biodiversity may have finished, but 2011 has been designated as the International Year of Forests. It will be officially launched during the Ninth Session of the UN Forum on Forests, which takes place in New York at the end of January. A logo has also been prepared which can be downloaded from the website for use as long as the guidelines are adhered to and a waiver form signed. The logo has been designed to convey the message of 'Forests for People' and highlights the central role of people in managing and conserving forests. We plan to prepare a special edition of the Euro-site-manager with a focus on forests later in 2011.



3. Raising Public Awareness of Biodiversity Issues



3.1 2nd February - World Wetlands Day

2nd February is designated as World Wetlands Day and this year will be given the theme of 'Wetlands and Forests' in recognition of the International Year of Forests. World Wetlands Day is run by the Ramsar Convention: this year Ramsar has produced materials, which raise awareness of the benefits provided by forested wetlands and the importance of forests for water. 3.2 French Awareness Raising Campaign

Six French conservation organisations launched a campaign in 2010 to raise awareness of biodiversity amongst the general public and involve people in collective and individual efforts to protect it. They have already gathered more than 20,000 signatories including some well-known French personalities. The strap-line for the campaign is “La biodiversité c’est ma nature” and Eurosite members working in French-speaking countries may be interested in promoting it. 3.3 New TEEB Website for the Public

The Economics of Ecosystems and Biodiversity (TEEB) reports, produced in 2010, have helped to raise awareness amongst policy-makers of the important contribution made by ecosystems and biodiversity to our economies and societies. A new initiative launched towards the end of 2010 called ‘TEEB4me’ aims to make TEEB accessible to the wider public, for example via social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter. 4. New Reports from the European Environment Agency (EEA)

4.1 New State and Outlook Report Launched

On 30th November 2010, Eurosite was invited to attend the launch of the EEA’s new State and Outlook Report on the European Environment. The report gives a comprehensive overview of the current state and trends facing the European environment and probable future scenarios, making it a useful source of reference information. It shows that environmental problems are becoming more complex and interconnected, which, combined with unprecedented global megatrends, is making them increasingly difficult to resolve. Each of the areas assessed reveals a similar story, with progress being made, but with efforts needing to be stepped up. For example, in the area of nature and biodiversity, significant progress has been made to designate protected areas and save some endangered species, but widespread alteration of landscapes, ecosystem degradation and loss of natural capital has continued.



In a speech at the launch, Janez Potočnik, EU Environment Commissioner, said: “*On the conservation status of our most important habitats and species, in air pollution, especially in our urban areas, it is clear we must do better*”, and, “*...in the marine environment, it tells us we need a comprehensive pan-European assessment, because we don’t have the data for all European Seas. On land, we need to know more about the relationship between land use and environmental impacts to assess trade-offs between land use and ecosystem services.*” He also spoke about the EU’s new Resource Efficiency initiative, which he views as an important tool for helping to tackle some of these challenges. 4.2 Interactive Maps on the Status of European Surface and Groundwater

The EEA has produced a number of online interactive maps, which show the status of surface water and groundwater at country and river basin levels. The maps relate to the implementation of the EU Water Framework Directive, which aims to protect and clean water across Europe. 5. Climate Change and Biodiversity - Feedback and Analysis of the UNFCCC Cancun Conference (COP16)

The 16th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP16) under the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), took place in Cancun in Mexico on the 29th November – 11th December. Compared to the failure of COP 15 in Copenhagen in 2009, the Mexico meeting was hailed as a success as the talks concluded with the 'Cancun Agreements', despite attempts by Bolivia to block it. The agreements were welcomed by the EU Commissioner for Climate Action, Connie Hedegaard. However, concern was also voiced by many that the Cancun Agreements fall far short of the action needed, as, whilst the agreements recognise the need for deeper cuts in emissions, they do not set out legally-binding targets for countries.

Key elements of the Cancun Agreements include: integration of emission pledges and a process for clarifying them; a commitment by developed countries to mobilise \$100 billion (€75bn) of funding for developing countries by 2020 through a Green Climate Fund; an Adaptation Framework; the launch of a REDD+ mechanism (Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Degradation) with technical and financial support; the establishment of a technology transfer mechanism and the agreement to continue negotiations for the future of the Kyoto Protocol. In terms of integrating biodiversity into climate change discussions, the Cancun Agreement reached on REDD+ represents a major step forward and was one of the big successes of the Conference. Start up funding has already been pledged to support action on it. 6. Agriculture – the future of the CAP

The EU Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) is due to be reformed in 2013. In preparation for this, DG Agriculture presented the following Communication in November 2010: "The CAP towards 2020: Meeting the Food, Natural Resources and Territorial Challenges of the Future". The purpose of the Communication is to highlight key challenges and major policy issues regarding EU agriculture and rural development, and to outline policy options for the future. The Communication states that: "*the future CAP should contain a greener and more equitably distributed first pillar and a second pillar focussing more on competitiveness and innovation, climate change and the environment.*" It also proposes the following main objectives for the future CAP: 1) viable food production, 2) sustainable management of natural resources and climate change, and 3) balanced territorial development.

The Communication sets out three options for future policy: option one requires the lowest level of changes to the existing policy; option two involves major changes to make it more sustainable; and, option three represents the most radical changes to the current CAP and is described as: "*a more far reaching reform of the CAP with a strong focus on environmental and climate change objectives, while moving away gradually from income support and most market measures.*" Whether CAP reform delivers real benefits for the environment depends on which of the three policy options the Commission chooses. DG Agriculture is expected to present legal proposals later this year. 7. The 2010 Red List of Finnish Species published

Liisa Nikula, Senior Advisor, International Cooperation Metsähallitus, Natural Heritage Services has informed Eurosite, that the 2010 Red List of Finland's Species was published on 1 Dec 2010. The publication can be found on: <http://www.environment.fi/redlist>. One general plus five more detailed press releases can be found on the same theme page. On this page you will also find the publication which is published with Finnish and English running side by side.

There are 2,247 threatened species in Finland, which is 10.5 per cent of the 21,400 species evaluated. The number of species evaluated is exceptionally large, even by international standards. In 2010, over 6,000 more species were evaluated than in the previous evaluation in 2000. During the last ten years, the status of 186 species (10.0 per cent of the 1,505 species evaluated in 2000) has improved, while that of 356 has deteriorated. This indicates that, whilst species continue to decline, conservation efforts are also producing results for many species.

Metsähallitus Natural Heritage Services have been very much involved in gathering the information and making the publication come true, together with many relevant organisations under the leadership of the Ministry of the Environment.

8. Dutch province donates jeeps to Odra Delta in Poland

The Dutch province of Noord-Brabant has donated two jeeps to conservation organisation EUCC Poland. Vereniging Natuurmonumenten has made it possible that the jeeps can be used in the Odra Delta nature reserve in Poland. This nature reserve is located near Stettin north of Berlin. The jeeps have been written off by the province, but in the area of the Odra Delta the cars can still be used well.

This gift is a first result of a close collaboration between Vereniging Natuurmonumenten and EUCC Poland, both long-standing Eurosite members. Since September 2010 they have an official twinning agreement, facilitated and supported by Eurosite. Eurosite had made it possible for managers from different regions across Europe to exchange knowledge and experience.

On Wednesday 15 December 2010, the official transfer of the jeeps was carried out by provincial representative Yves Boyer to Dr. Kazimierz Rabski of EUCC Poland in front of the provincial house in 's-Hertogenbosch. The Polish and Dutch site managers drove the two cars to the Odra Delta together very early on Thursday morning. In Poland upon arrival a meeting about the area, the use of the jeeps and field visits were planned.

The staff of EUCC Poland have expressed their great thanks and are very happy with their latest assets. It's been EUCC's long-term wish to make use of a 4x4 jeep. Although concerns about Natura 2000 remain, the two jeeps are valuable tools which will make site management tasks in the nature reserve a bit easier.
